Engagement, Partnerships, and Professional Development

Ready At Five values the partnerships that enable us to impact the work of early childhood professionals and the children and families that they serve in Maryland. We believe that families are their children's first teachers and the best way for us to reach families is through child care providers and PreK teachers. Our learning materials continued to be downloaded or purchased on our website, and shipped to various child care programs, libraries, schools and families throughout the state. We were proud to continue to partner with Arts for Learning on their Early Learning Video Portal - which provides access to a growing library of Early Learning videos that engage young children and child care providers in joyful arts experiences and instruction by Wolf Trap teaching artists. We were happy to partner with MDAEYC on the "Each and Every Child: Teaching Preschool with an Equity Lens" Educator and Administrator Cohorts. The Month of the Young Child was celebrated in April jointly with several other organizations such as: Arts for Learning Maryland, Baltimore Symphony Orchestra, Chesapeake Arts Center, the Delaplaine Arts Center, Irvine Nature Center, MDAEYC, Maryland Family Network, Maryland Hall, Maryland Head Start Association, Maryland State Library Agency, MSCCA, Maryland State Family Child Care Association, Port Discovery Children's Museum, Prince George's County Memorial Library System, and Strathmore. We offered the second cohort of LETRS Trainings which commenced in September 2023 and finished in March 2024. Our continued participation in the Giant Food Community Bag Program enabled us to raise funds all year long.
